Dear Parents/Guardians,

On Tuesday, 28<sup>th</sup> of March, Oran Park High School will be celebrating Harmony Day to coincide with our fortnightly assembly. Harmony Day celebrates Australia's cultural diversity. It's about inclusiveness, respect and a sense of belonging for everyone. On this day, students are permitted to attend school wearing an orange accessory or T-shirt. If they are participating in the parade or performances they can wear cultural attire all day.

The following guidelines apply to Harmony Day at Oran Park High School:

- Students can wear an **Orange** accessory **or T-shirt** with their full school uniform. Students who are participating in any aspect of our Harmony Day assembly can wear **Cultural Clothing** for the day.
- Clothes must not contain offensive slogans, pictures or words, political messages, or any design which may cause offence.
- Clothes must be safe and appropriate for a normal school day e.g. overly revealing clothes such as micro minis, midriff/crop tops and ripped jeans/pants will not be permitted.
- Students must consider the safety of shoes if they have practical subjects on the day. Bare feet, thongs, open-toed shoes, sandals and heels **will not be permitted in the school.**
- Students must bring sport uniform to school if they have sport on this day.

Parents of students performing in the assembly will be sent a separate email with an invitation to attend the assembly.

We look forward to sharing our Harmony Day celebrations with our school community.
