Our Culture & Brand

We refer to our brand mark or school logo as 'Connection to Country'. The Connection to Country mark:

- signals the importance of indigenous heritage and connection to the environment.
- visual elements consist of: river, hills, star and waratah. The star as a central element combines indigenous and western symbolism and reflects the aspirations for the school and students – to reach for the stars.
- makes subtle reference to the Oran Park racing history through the wreath form (and its link to Oran Park Public School) but cleverly uses a waratah floral element – not only the state floral emblem but also the totem flower for the local Dharawal language group.

Curriculum

In Year 7 and 8 our students study the following subjects:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- History/Geography
- PDHPE
- Technology Mandatory
- Music
- Visual Arts
- Sport
- Middle School Program

Year 8 study a mandatory language which at Oran Park High School is Korean. From Year 9, students are also offered electives including Child Studies, Commerce, Design and Technology, Drama, Food Technology, Hospitality – Certificate I, Industrial Technology, iSTEM, Music, Photographic and Digital Media, Physical Activity and Sports Studies, Textiles Technology, Visual Arts.

Oran Park High School is fortunate to also have a Disability Support Unit with classes for students diagnosed with Autism and Multi-Categorical Disabilities. Students are placed in these classes via a regional panel process.

Facilities

The school has over 90 innovative, air conditioned learning spaces including :

- Flexible, future focussed classrooms
- Maker spaces
- Lecture theatres
- Fitness studio
- Dance/drama studio
- Breakout spaces and seminar rooms
- School hall incorporating two basketball courts and a full stage
- Library and Senior Learning Centre
- Hospitality kitchen and Café
- Visual Arts and Technology and Design display galleries







Wellbeing

The Wellbeing team consists of the Year Advisers, Deputy Principals, School Counsellor and Learning Support Teachers. The role of the Wellbeing team is to:

- support the wellbeing needs of students at Oran Park High School
- seek solutions to wellbeing issues, both general and individual
- refer wellbeing needs to specialist services or agencies, where appropriate
- coordinate activities and implement programs to support the wellbeing needs of students
- drive TRAK values across the school


TRAK

- Twitter


